Competition Rules

A team should consist of a minimum of 2 students, although it is recommended that more than 2 students comprise a team in order to expose more students to this competition. 2 students from each team answer each question; the highest possible score for each team is 10 points per meet.

Each grade level contest (7, 8, 9) consists of 5 questions, each of which is timed.

On questions where a calculator may be used, any non-graphing, non-programmable calculator is allowed.

The responsibility of the host school and coach:

- Provide proper testing atmosphere for all contestants
- Be sure timing is accurately adhered to
- Mail all white top sheets of the scoresheet form to the Director(s) by the day after the meet
- The coach of each team receives the copy of the scoresheet, and should retain it for the competition year to verify published results.

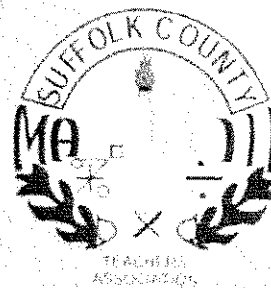
Competition:

- All contests will begin no later than 5:00PM nor earlier than 2:00PM on the scheduled date. Exceptions may be approved by the Director(s)
- Substitutions on a team may be made on the initiative of the team advisor, provided that the next problem has not been distributed.
- No one may leave the contest room without the permission of the teacher in charge.
- A copy of the contest problem will be given face-down to each contestant. Students may turn over their question when the teacher in charge begins to read the question. After the questions have been read to each grade level, the timekeeper will give the signal to begin. The contestant may not begin work before the timekeeper's signal to start or work past the signal to stop. The timekeeper should give a one-minute warning.
- The answer must be entered into the answer box on the answer sheet. Only this answer may be graded by the scorer(s). The only acceptable answer is the one on the provided answer key (or its mathematical equivalent).
- Each answer should be listed on the reporting scoresheet. Failure to do so will disqualify the student/team from receiving credit for an answer that is subsequently accepted as correct as the result of an appeal.

All scores are considered final 1 week after the mailing of the monthly report.

APPEALS:

Team advisors must notify the Director of any appeals within 2 days of the contest. The decision of the Director(s) is final and will apply to all contestants whose answers are recorded on the score reporting form.
